

Announcement of MERIT-BASED GRANTS for the academic year 2019/20 at Sigmund Freud University in accordance with §§ 57-61 of the 1992 Student Support Act (StudFG)

Merit-based grants recognize excellent academic achievements of students studying in a regular degree program.

A merit-based grant shall at least amount to 750 Euros and shall not exceed 1,500 Euros.

APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

Citizenship of an EEA member state or equal treatment of nationals (according to §4 StudFG)

You are treated as a national if you

- have an "EU permanent residence card"
- are Swiss and have lived in Austria for five years without interruption
- are stateless, and
 - were subject to unlimited income tax liability in Austria for at least five years prior to their first admission to the SFU together with one parent, and
 - had the centre of their life interests here during this period
- are refugees
- are British citizens

Regular student at the Sigmund Freud University (at all SFU locations)

Adherence to the duration of entitlement (§ 18 StudFG), taking into account any important reasons (§ 19 StudFG): The duration of entitlement basically comprises the period of study planned for the course of study plus one additional semester. When calculating the duration of entitlement, the duration of studies in the old curriculum is added up if you change to a new curriculum.

Excellent academic achievements of a regular course of study relevant to the course of study in the **minimum amount of 40 ECTS points:**

- **Field of study Psychotherapy Science (PTS):** Date of examination according to the academic year (from 1.9.2019 to 31.8.2020)
- **Field of study Psychology (PSY):** Date of examination according to academic year (23.9.2019 to 22.9.2020)

Grade point average: maximum 1.5

- Performances that have been assessed with "successfully completed" are generally taken into account in the assessment and are rated "very good" if the ECTS points specified in the curriculum are achieved.

- The bachelor thesis as well as the master thesis and the respective final examinations are included in the evaluation.
- Doctoral studies in psychotherapy science: The doctoral studies must have been completed within the calculation period; the dissertation must have been assessed as "very good" and the final examination as "very good" or "good".

Deadline for applications: Monday, 28 September to Friday, 16 October 2020

APPLICATION PROCESS:

- PTS: **Personal submission** with completed application form and copies of all relevant confirmations for the **practical parts of the studies** (PE/MPE, internship, reflection on the internship, practice, reflection on practice, teaching analysis, individual or group supervision), at the Studien Service Center PTW, no proof of success
- PSY: Personal submission with completed application form at the Study Service Center of the respective faculty, no proof of success

Necessary evidence of equality of treatment with nationals and any important reasons for extending the entitlement period must also be enclosed.

AWARD: All applicants* will be notified of the award or rejection by e-mail. There is no legal claim to the award (§ 61 Abs 2 StudFG).

If too many students meet the minimum requirements in relation to the funds made available, only those students will be considered for the award who can demonstrate the best performance (grade point average lower than 1.5) and who have achieved significantly more than 40 ECTS points. If there are too many eligible students, it is possible that students who already received a scholarship in the last academic year will not be considered in this year's distribution.
